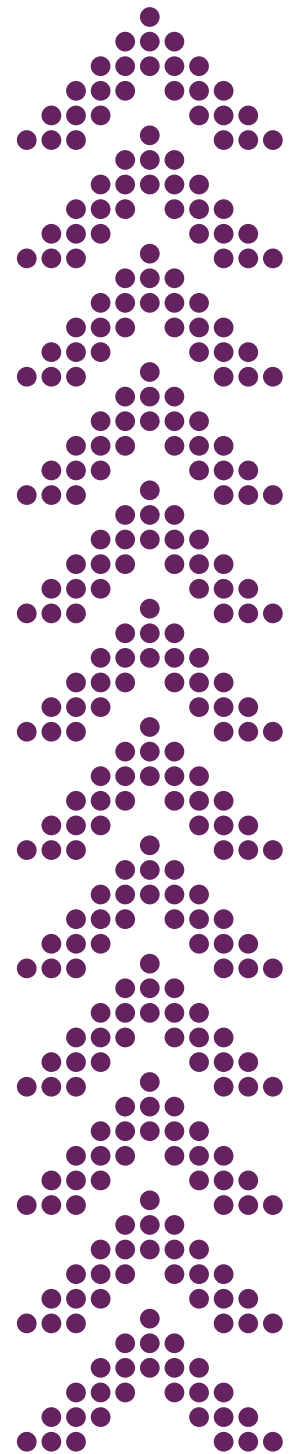
The Workforce and Economic Development Network of Pennsylvania (WEDnetPA) is a state-funded reimbursement program designed to help eligible Pennsylvania businesses offset the cost of training their existing workforce. Through WEDnetPA, eligible companies can receive up to **\$2,000 per employee per fiscal year** back on eligible training expenses — meaning that upskilling your team doesn't strain your bottom line.

You choose the training. You choose the training provider. You choose when the training takes place. The training is built around your company. Whether your team needs technical skills, leadership development or training on new equipment, WEDnetPA is flexible enough to meet your business where it is. Training can take place in a classroom, online or at your facility — on your schedule and tailored to your needs.

Since its beginning in 1999, WEDnetPA has grown to become the primary delivery system for Pennsylvania's incumbent workforce training. Over its history, the program has helped more than 24,700 companies train over 1.3 million Pennsylvania workers; from small manufacturers to large enterprises, all reaping the rewards of a more skilled, more productive team. Funded by the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED), the WEDnetPA program focuses on the state's high-priority industries including ***life sciences, energy, agriculture, robotics & technology or manufacturing.***

Accessing WEDnetPA funds is simple. WEDnetPA is an alliance of 22 partners across Pennsylvania, each serving as your point of contact for developing a training plan and applying for reimbursement funding. Your local WEDnetPA partner guides you through every step of the WEDnetPA process, from answering questions, identifying eligible training and submitting for reimbursement, so you can stay focused on running your business.

2026-2027 FUNDING GUIDE

ELIGIBILITY

To obtain funds through WEDnetPA, your company, employees and training must meet the eligibility criteria below. Please visit wednetpa.com for additional criteria in the comprehensive Company Guidelines.

Each year, WEDnetPA eligibility guidelines are reviewed to ensure alignment with Pennsylvania's evolving economic priorities. *A Ten-Year Strategic Plan for Economic Development in Pennsylvania*, published in 2024, identifies five key industries—**life sciences, energy, agriculture, robotics & technology and manufacturing**.

To support this vision, WEDnetPA eligibility is focused on companies that directly align with these priority industry sectors. Companies will provide their primary NAICS (North American Industry Classification System) code to determine program eligibility.

IS MY COMPANY ELIGIBLE?

- Must be physically located in Pennsylvania.
- Must be life sciences, agriculture, energy, robotics & technology or manufacturing and primarily business-to-business.
- Cannot receive funding more than two years in a row or three out of five years.
- All locations under the same FEIN are considered a single company subject to the company cap.

ARE MY EMPLOYEES ELIGIBLE?

- Must be a resident of and employed in Pennsylvania.
- Must earn at least \$17.31/hour excluding benefits.
- Must be permanently employed full-time and eligible for full time benefits, that include healthcare coverage, at the time of training.
- Be an employee of the company and location for which a contract is awarded.
- Must be of legal working age in PA and legally eligible to work in the United States.

IS MY TRAINING ELIGIBLE?

- Must be skill building for current job or promotion with the goal of strengthening the company's retention, capabilities, performance and competitiveness.
- Must start and be completed within the fiscal year (July 1 through June 30) for which the funds are awarded. Partial training cannot be reimbursed.
- Training costs must be "reasonable" as defined by market rates and other criteria.
- Each training session must be a minimum of 30 minutes in length.
- Company orientation and on-the-job training are not eligible.

WEDNETPA TRAINING PROGRAM MAKES PENNSYLVANIA COMPANIES MORE COMPETITIVE AND PRODUCTIVE.

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, through the Department of Community & Economic Development (DCED) funds the WEDnetPA program. Companies can apply online and select any WEDnetPA partner — including State System universities, community colleges and other educational providers (see page 7 for complete listing). Through the program, your company can benefit from a wide range of training that will put your employees on the path to higher performance.



THE FOLLOWING BUSINESSES ARE NOT ELIGIBLE:

Any company with a six-digit NAICS code that does not directly align with the five eligible key industries.

Exclusions include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Direct cannabis businesses
- Educational institutions
- Employment/Staffing agencies
- Gaming establishments
- Government agencies and facilities
- Non-profits (except general medical and surgical hospitals)
- Training providers
- Retail businesses
- Construction
- Architectural firms
- Engineering firms

APPLY

Whether you are new to WEDnetPA or have worked with us in the past, go to wednetpa.com/apply to submit an inquiry on/after August 1, 2026. Follow the prompts for new or existing companies. Your company primary NAICS code is required to determine eligibility. When eligibility is confirmed by our WEDnetPA partner, complete the online application and training plan to request grant funds. If you have questions along the way, please reach out to one of our 22 statewide WEDnetPA partners.

TRAIN

When your application is approved, accept your grant offer by electronically signing the DocuSign agreement that arrives by email, then submit training.

INVOICE

When a training event is completed, submit your documentation within 45 days and you'll be reimbursed for eligible costs.

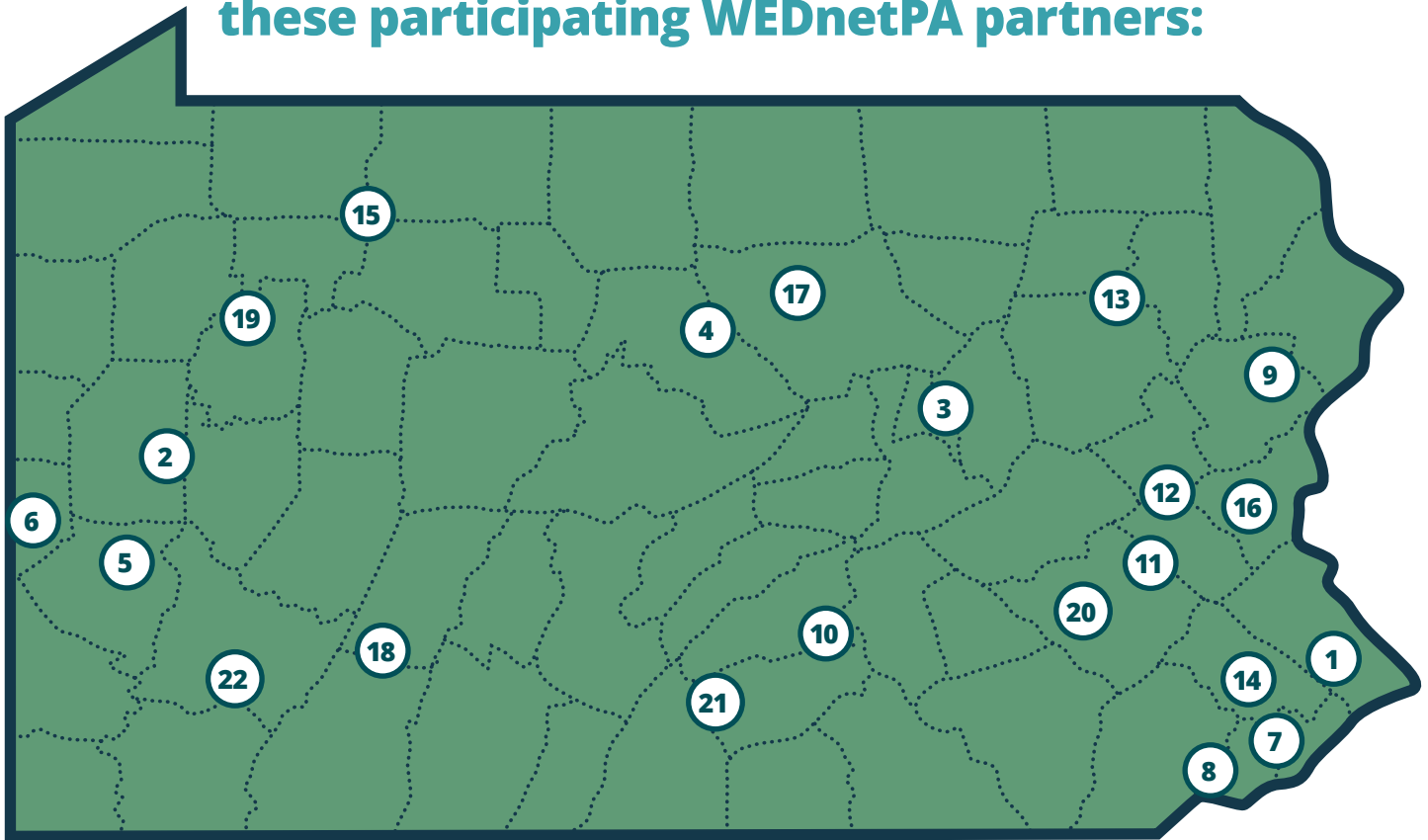
